ESSENTIALS FOR A GOOD START IN STRINGS

A good instrument is essential for success in the orchestra class. Some instruments have been unable to stand up to the rigors of class work. If possible, please avoid any instrument labeled:

1. Stanek
2. Frederic
3. Sears

These instruments are inexpensive but have been found to require an unusual amount of maintenance that results in lost learning time. Most reputable dealers will not rent or sell these products.

The following equipment is necessary for your child to play a string instrument:

VIOLIN – Instrument and case with name tag; rosin; extra set of strings; shoulder rest or soft sponge with rubber band; clean soft cloth; folding music stand; music folder (usually given by the music store); pencils; Book 1 – Essential Elements 2000 for Strings by Allen, Gillespie, & Hayes

VIOLA - Instrument and case with name tag; rosin; extra set of strings; shoulder rest or soft sponge with rubber band; clean soft cloth; folding music stand; music folder (usually given by the music store); pencils; Book 1 – Essential Elements 2000 for Strings by Allen, Gillespie, & Hayes

CELLO - Instrument and case with name tag; rosin; rock stops or end pin rest; clean soft cloth; folding music stand; music folder (usually given by the music store); pencils; Book 1 – Essential Elements 2000 for Strings by Allen, Gillespie, & Hayes

BASS - Instrument and case with name tag; rosin; rock stops or end pin rest; clean soft cloth; folding music stand; music folder (usually given by the music store); pencils; Book 1 – Essential Elements 2000 for Strings by Allen, Gillespie, & Hayes

Once the student has the instrument, proper care should be taken not to damage it. Remember to handle the instrument, bow and case with care. Bumping the instrument can cause it to go out the adjustment. Keep the instrument clean. Do not let others play or handle the instrument.
